Law and ethics bulletin

Changes to the arrangements for dealing with Controlled Drug requisitions — Part II

This Law and Ethics Bulletin forms the second and final part of a series. This bulletin gives information on the submission processes in place for Schedule 1, 2 or 3 Controlled Drug requisitions. A previous bulletin (Part I), published on 15 December 2007 (p697), covered the handling of requisitions in community pharmacy against which supplies of Controlled Drugs for human use are made. (NB — prescribers cannot normally obtain and prescribe Schedule 1 Controlled Drugs without the authority of a Home Office licence.)

These changes came into force on 1 January 2008, and apply to England, Scotland and Wales.

Dedicated standardised requisition forms have been introduced in England, (FP10CDF), Scotland (CDRF) and Wales (WP10CDF) for the ordering of Schedule 1, 2 and 3 Controlled Drugs. Although it is not a legal requirement to do so, persons who wish to obtain stocks of these Controlled Drugs from a community pharmacy should use the respective standardised requisition form. The Department of Health, the Scottish Executive and the Department of Health and Social Services Wales (DHSSW) expect persons ordering Controlled Drugs from community pharmacies to use these forms routinely.

Once the requisition of a Schedule 1, 2 or 3 Controlled Drug has been duly marked by the pharmacist (with the pharmacy stamp containing the pharmacy's name and address), and supplied against, the pharmacist should make a copy of the requisition. The copy must be preserved and retained by the pharmacist for two years from the date of supply.

The original requisition form should then be sent to the relevant NHS agency. This is the Prescription Pricing Division (PPD) in England, the NHS National Services Scotland (NSS) in Scotland, and Health Solutions Wales (HSW) in Wales. The relevant NHS agency will retain the original requisition for two years from the date of submission.

In exceptional circumstances, where a form other than the standardised requisition is used, there is still a legal requirement to submit the original requisition to the relevant NHS agency, and to retain a copy.

Although it is not a legal requirement to provide a requisition where one community pharmacy supplies another community pharmacy, both the Society and the Department of Health or the Scottish Executive or the DHSSW, advise that, as a matter of good practice, a written requisition should be obtained. This type of requisition should also be submitted to the relevant NHS agency for processing.

England Original requisition forms should be sent to the PPD by the fifth day of the following month, using the code used to submit private Controlled Drug prescriptions, ie, the F code, along with the submission document FP34PCD.

The requisitions should be separated from the NHS prescription forms and from the private Controlled Drug prescription forms. Suppliers who need to submit requisitions but do not already have a private Controlled Drug prescription F code must contact their local primary care trust (or its agency). The necessary arrangements will then be made with the PPD.

Scotland Original requisitions should be submitted to the NSS by the fifth day of the following month, along with the submission document CD34, copies of which can be obtained from Practitioner Services, 3 Bain Square, Kirkton Campus, Livingston EH54 7DQ (tel 01506 705100; fax 01506 705191).

A specific form for use by one community pharmacy to obtain stock from another community pharmacy has been developed in Scotland and should be used for this purpose. Currently, these forms are available from Practitioner Services (details as above).

Wales The original requisitions should be submitted along with the NHS prescriptions and private Controlled Drug prescriptions in the usual manner using the updated submission document WP34. The requisitions should be separated from the NHS prescription forms and from the private Controlled Drug prescription forms.

The Society will continue to read and interpret signed declarations as though they contained the text above.

Guidance produced by the Society for deciding whether to be practising or non-practising, particularly the sections "Myths and misconceptions" and "Exercising professional judgement", remains current despite amendment to the definition of practice made by the Pharmacists and Pharmacy Technicians Order (2007) and is available at www.rpsgb.org/pdfs/retfedecguid.pdf.

Disciplinary Committee

The Disciplinary Committee will meet at the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, 1 Lambeth High Street, London SE1, on Monday 21, Tuesday 22, Wednesday 23, and Thursday 24 January 2008 at 9.30am to hear the following Statutory Committee inquiries:

1. The new inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against **Matthew Duncan Mollen** (registration number 1071281) which alleges that regularly ordering for and/or supplying to an individual Valoid (cyclizine) tablets contrary to the requirements of Key

Responsibilities 1 and 2 and Paragraph 10(e) of Part 3 of the Code of Ethics, may amount to misconduct.

2. The new inquiry into **Yousef Mohammad** (registration number 1066704) who on 31 July 2006 at the Crown Court at Winchester pleaded guilty to and was convicted upon indictment of theft, for which offence he was ordered on 1 September 2006 to (i) pay a fine of £600 within three months, (ii) pay compensation in the sum of £200 to the Alliance Pharmacy within three months, and (iii) contribute £250 towards the costs of the prosecution.

3. The new inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against **Salvatore Ferrigno** (Registration number 53060) which alleges that: dispensing to a patient four boxes each containing seven buprenorphine (Subutex) tablets 2mg and each labelled as seven buprenorphine tablets 2mg in response to a prescription calling for 50 buprenorphine tablets 200µg; dispensing 28 rosiglitazone maleate tablets 8mg labelled as rosiglitazone maleate tablets 4mg in response to a prescription calling for 28 rosiglitazone maleate tablets 4mg and endorsing the prescription to show that 28 rosiglitazone maleate tablets 4mg had been supplied; dispensing a box containing 50 dihydrocodeine tablets 30mg labelled as containing 100 dihydrocodeine tablets 30mg in response to a prescription calling for 50 dihydrocodeine tablets 30mg; dispensing 94ml methadone mixture 1mg/1ml to a patient in response to an instalment prescription calling for 100ml methadone mixture 1mg/1ml; and, supplying 75ml methadone mixture 1mg/ml in response to a prescription

calling for 25ml methadone mixture 1mg/ml, may amount to misconduct.

4. The new inquiry into a complaint by the Council of the Society against **Angus McGregor** (registration number 62111) which alleges that: the supply of Nuseals aspirin tablets 300mg against a prescription calling for 56 Nuseals aspirin tablets 75mg; the supply of 12 diazepam 5mg tablets and 184ml methadone mixture 1mg/1ml to a patient A which were intended for a patient B, against patient A's prescription calling for 12 diazepam tablets 5mg; a failure to record in the Controlled Drugs Register the supply of methadone above; a failure to record in the Controlled Drugs Register a later supply to patient B of 184ml methadone mixture 1mg/1ml; the supply of doxazosin 2mg tablets incorrectly labelled as doxazosin 4mg tablets; the supply of atenolol tablets 100mg against a prescription calling for 56 allopurinol tablets 100mg; and, the supply of Isotard 60 XL tablets 60mg, incorrectly labelled as aspirin dispersible 75mg tablets, against a prescription calling for 56 Isotard 40 XL tablets 40 mg, may amount to misconduct.

TRIBUTES

Jackson In a tribute to the late William Arthur Jackson (see above), D.A. HUTTON writes: The death of Bill Jackson, just before Christmas, is a great loss for his wife Audrey, their family and friends, and for the study of the history of pharmacy in Britain. A graduate of Manchester University, Bill was registered as FPS in 1951, practised briefly in industry, then as a community pharmacist until his retirement, when he gained an MSc from Manchester University with a treatise on the stomach pump. All his adult life, he collected pharmaceutical and medical artefacts and literature, the source and inspiration of much of his published work. As a very knowledgeable collector and historian, always ready to loan items for exhibitions both here and abroad, and to give help and

advice, he gained an international reputation and many friends. He was a very active member of the British Society for History of Pharmacy, a committee member for many years, and its president from 1991–92. He was a recipient of the Leslie Matthews medal, and a member of the International Academy for the History of Pharmacy. For many years, he was honorary (later emeritus) curator of Manchester University medical museum, for which he organised many exhibitions. He was the author of "The Victorian Chemist and Druggist" (1981) and contributed over 30 articles to *Pharmaceutical Historian* and many more to publications in the UK, Australia and the US. His writings, carefully researched and documented, illuminated obscure areas of pharmaceutical history with humour and, occasionally, bravery. In the spirit of true scientific curiosity, he tested one invention, the Neu-Vita Occuliser for frictional massage of the eyeball, with uncomfortable results.

Though stricken with poliomyelitis as a child, with its life long consequences, wherever Bill was, there was always laughter and wisdom.

Rowe In a tribute to the late Harold Archibald Rowe, E. C. BURROW writes: By the death of Harold Arbichald Rowe, the Plymouth branch has lost one of its senior members. Archie served his apprenticeship with Balkwill & Co, of Plymouth. After qualifying as a pharmacist, Archie spent a while at Bognor Regis. He volunteered for the army and was stationed at the Tower of London before being sent to India. Soon after Archie bought a pharmacy in King Street, Plymouth.

He was chairman of the Plymouth branch in 1964 and continued to attend lectures after his 90th birthday.
